Fisheries Monitoring Program on Charleston Lake

The Ministry of Natural Resources is responsible for monitoring the abundance and health of fish populations in the lakes and rivers across Ontario.

On July 21, 2014, the Ministry of Natural Resources began a netting operation on Charleston. The program is designed to monitor the current and changing state of fisheries across Ontario. This is year two of the second five-year cycle to collect information for fisheries management. Approximately 140 lakes were assessed this year. MNR crews will collect information on fish species, take water samples, and check for invasive species.

Biological data was collected by the science crews to provide MNR biologists with information about abundance, age structure, mortality, and maturity of the types of fish in the lake. Recreational fishing is enjoyed annually by over 1.3 millions anglers, and contributes nearly \$2.5 billion to the First Annual Sunfish Tournament on June Ontario economy. The MNR is working to maintain healthy fish stocks for future generations to continue to enjoy high-quality fishing. Please share your fish diaries with us.



Bowfin or "Dogfish"

Dogfish is another name for these fish. It is distinguished from other fish by the long dorsal fin which arches over most of the fishes back. The head is flattened on top, and the mouth is large and provided with sharp teeth, strongly set in the jaws. Like the longnose gar, this fish is capable of breathing air. Like gars, the bowfin prefers sluggish, weedy waters. Bowfin usually grow between 18-24in. Scott and Crossman's definitive scientific work, The Freshwater Fishes of Canada, and they say: "the flesh, although edible, is very soft and jellylike and not considered of much value."However, another reference says, "The flesh is dry, has a mild flavour and when moulded into patties, dipped in egg and bread crumbs or corn meal, it makes passably good eating." -Information retrieved from MNR, Outdoor Canada and Ontario Fish Species.

Frontenac Arch Biosphere (FAB)

The Frontenac Arch is a southern arm of the Canadian Shield. Its sideways windswept, pine topped ridges and lake-jeweled valleys distinctly contrast with most of the southern Ontario landscape. A billion years ago, this was a dramatic landscape of massive, towering mountains, heaved skyward as early continental plates collided. After hundreds of millions of years, these mountains weathered down to their roots - the landscape you experience today.

The Frontenac Arch connects the Canadian Shield boreal forest to the forests of the Adirondack and Appalachian Mountains - a natural north-south migration route. The St. Lawrence River Valley connects the Great Lakes and forested heartland of the continent to the forests of the Atlantic Coast. The FAB is at the very centre of that intersection, and so five forest regions merge and intermingle here, creating a great diversity of plant and animal communities.

Charleston Lake Historical Plaque

Charleston Lake is full of wonderful history and a plaque has been placed at the main dock in Charleston to commemorate some of our historical events and building structures. In 1840 the village had a general store with dry goods, wine, groceries, crockery, hardware and produce. It also had a post office, which burnt in 1956, and a boat house livery stable. We had two lovely hotels on the waterfront; the Harbor View Hotel and Cedar Park Inn.

The Hanson Memorial Church is once again in operation for the summer months. It was built in memory

of Walter H. Hanson. In 1929, work started on the church and on July 23, 1933 the church was dedicated to Mrs. Hanson. The church was reopened in 1979, much to the villages delight. Several weddings have taken place at our lovely little church on the hill.

The plaque is rich with lake history and pictures, so be sure to stop by and enjoy our new addition to the lakefront.
